

## The 35th WEDC International Conference

In celebration of the 40th anniversary of WEDC in 2011, we are very pleased to invite you to Loughborough University, UK, where WEDC is based for the 35th WEDC Conference.

The WEDC International Conference, which is typically held in either Africa or Asia, is a practitioner and research focused conference, exchanging knowledge and experiences in the water and sanitation sector. Although hosting the conference in the UK is a break from a 34 year-long tradition, we feel this is a unique event and an exciting way to celebrate the 40th year of WEDC.

Prior to the conference, on Tuesday July 5th, we will hold an Open Day at WEDC. As well as registering for the conference, you will also be able to visit the WEDC Resources Centre, attend sessions on using the WEDC Knowledge Base, and speak to staff and current students about WEDC courses and research studentships or any other continuing professional development interests you may have. In the week following the conference, we will offer a range of short courses.

The numbers are limited to 250. We particularly encourage delegates from low-income countries from the public and private sectors, Higher Education and research institutes, donors and bi-lateral agencies and NGO practitioners to submit papers.

WEDC is one of the world's leading education and research institutes for developing knowledge and capacity in water and sanitation for sustainable development and emergency relief. We focus on solutions for people in low-and middle-income countries, helping to provide evidence-based answers to important questions – not only about what needs to be done to improve basic infrastructure and essential services – but also how to go about it.

The WEDC International Conference is a highly respected, global platform for leaders of water and sanitation innovation in low-income countries. The 35th Conference will address issues from across the sector, bringing together practitioners, decision makers and researchers from different sub-sectors and from the field, government office or university laboratory, to exchange views and present the latest findings through presentations, discussions and informal networking.

### **Emerging issues**

Looking back over 35 years of WEDC conferences, there have been many changes and developments in the water and sanitation sector. Looking to the future, continued innovation will be necessary to meet the challenges of a changing world.

Some of these changes will be environmental, as global changes to the climate increase flooding in some areas and water scarcity in others. We will need to prepare for disasters and plan an effective emergency response. Individuals, communities and cities will become increasingly vulnerable. Pressure on natural resources will necessitate more efficient use of water as demands and conflicts increase. Appropriate technologies originally developed for high-income countries might offer potential solutions in some of these areas. Protection of existing finite resources will mean tackling problems of manmade pollution, especially through improved urban sanitation and addressing naturally occurring contaminants such as arsenic and fluoride.

There are exciting social and technical innovations at a community and individual level. Community-led Total Sanitation (CLTS), self-supply of water and household water treatment are bringing fresh insight into delivering basic services, putting real power into the hands of the users. This changing role for individuals and communities extends throughout the sector, with NGOs, the private sector and governments adapting to a shifting institutional environment. The role of the private sector extends beyond providing services, to providing financial and human resources as part of corporate social responsibility. As ever, financing the sector generally is a challenge, requiring new funding mechanisms, both large and small.

The research that underpins innovative approaches needs to be managed well. Putting research into use means engaging with practitioners to ensure delivery, so capacity building and monitoring progress are essential components of success. Sound research should also be supporting policy development.

Papers are invited that address these and other issues related to the future of water, sanitation and hygiene in low-income countries.

All submissions of briefing papers are reviewed by WEDC. Submissions of all refereed papers are reviewed both by WEDC and an external referee.

Authors will have the opportunity to make corrections and clarifications.

Final notification of acceptance will be by

31 March 2011

It is vital that the deadline dates for submissions are adhered to in order to allow time for reviewers to assess the paper and to give authors opportunity to make corrections, and ensure inclusion of papers in the conference pre-prints and programme.

Accepted papers and posters to be presented at the conference will appear in the Pre-prints. After the Conference, the Proceedings will be available on CD and papers will be available for free download from the WEDC Knowledge Base.
