#### RAINFALL SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

#### <u>BIHAR</u>

- No significant rainfall has been reported in the State.
- About **43,18,000 people** from **2434 villages** in **16** have been affected due to flood in the State.
- **02 human deaths** have been reported by the State today. The total human death toll of the State is **120.**
- 129 cattle livestock have been perished so far
- 3,18,900 houses are reported to have been damaged due to flood so far.
- **3521 boats** have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations in the flood affected areas of the State.
- **1027860 persons** have been evacuated from the affected areas so far.
- **359 relief camps** have been opened in the flood affected area in which **3,35,410** people have been accommodated.
- **154 cattle camps** are opened in the affected areas in which about **21105** animals accommodated.
- **177 medical teams** have been deployed in the affected areas of the State.
- **355 Health Centre** have also been opened in the flood affected areas of the State for providing medical care.

### UTTAR PRADESH

- Light to moderate rainfall has been reported in some parts of the State during last 24 hours.
- 05 human deaths have been reported by the State during last 24 hours.

- About 2,42,707 houses (5991 fully and 236716 partially) have been damaged so far.
- About **57,376 people** from the affected areas have been evacuated so far.
- **3436 cattle/livestock** are reported to have been perished.
- **2.68** lakh ha areas have been damaged.
- **449 relief camps** have been opened in the flood affected areas in which **48429 people** have been accommodated.
- **4,328 boats** have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations in the affected areas.

## CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION

According to the **Central Water Commission (CWC)** report dated **13<sup>th</sup> September**, 2008, there are **02 Moderates** and **13 Low flood situation sites**. The details of **moderate flood** sites are as under:-

## <u>Assam</u>

- River Brahamputra at Dibrugarh is flowing at 105.05m against the danger level of 104.24m with a falling trend.
- River Dhansiri(S) at Numaligarh is flowing at 78.08m against the danger level of 77.42m with a steady trend.

- On 18.08.2008, a long embankment was swept away at Kushaha in Nepal, about 7 km away from the Kosi Barrage at Birpur in Supaul.

As a result, large areas of **Supaul**, **Madhepura**, **Katihar**, **Saharsa** and **Araria** have been flooded/inundated and affected severely. More areas in these districts are getting inundated, submerged under deep water and numerous other embankments are under threat of being breached.
- In Supaul District, about 8,93,790 people in 243 villages and 73 Panchayats (68 fully & 5 partially) have been badly affected.

- Basantpur, Chhattapur, Pratapganj, Triveniganj and Raghopur are the worst affected blocks in the district.
- **42** relief camps are opened in the district in which about **62,695** people have been accommodated.
- **456** local boats, 01 government boat and 28 motor boats have been pressed into service for relief and rescue operations.
- About **3,70,000** people have been evacuated from the affected areas so far.
- **22,367** Kachha, **2233** pacca houses and 1,98,846 juggis have been damaged so far.
- 20 cattle camps established in the district in which about 21,105 cattle accommodated and 3354 cattle were given treatment.
- About 66830 ha area has been damaged in the State so far.
- In Madhepura District, about 11.55 lakh people in 378 villages have been badly affected. 130 Panchayats have been affected severely.
  - About 11 blocks in the district have been partly submerged. The worst affected areas are Alamnagar, Uda Kishanganj, Kumarkhand, Gwalpada, Bihariganj, Purani, Chawsha, Shankerpur, Sindgheshwar, Madhepura and Murliganj.
  - Flood water has been reported to be receding from the affected areas.
  - **418** boats have been pressed into service for relief and rescue operations.
  - 97 Relief Camps have been opened in the affected areas in which about **54,222** people have taken shelter.
  - More than **3,27,458** people have been evacuated so far from the affected areas.
  - **29** cattle camps opened in which about **5191** cattle were given treatment.
  - 34 medical camps have also been established in the affected areas.
- In Araria District, about 3,86,328 people in 04 blocks and in 96 villages have been badly affected.
  - The worst affected areas in the district are Forbishganj, Raniganj, Bhairgama and Narpatganj.
  - 66 Relief camps have been opened in the district in which about 81,439 people have been accommodated.
  - **89** boats and **84** motor boats are pressed into service for relief and rescue operations.
  - **26432** people have been evacuated from the affected areas so far.
  - **15** cattle camps and **40** medical camps have also been established in the affected areas.
