ABOUT THE LOCATION



All the villages selected for the project fall in the rain shadow region of Western Ghats. The area receives ample of rainfall during monsoon (average annual rainfall is 2100 mm) but gets completely parched by February / March, leading to acute water scarcity thereafter till onset of next monsoon.

OBJECTIVE OF THE PROJECT



- To make the tribal villages adjoining our product pipeline which is near Kasara Ghat Water - Sufficient.
- To provide safe drinking water for people.
- To enable villagers grow crop through out the year.
- Stop temporary but perennial migration of villagers during February- June which will ultimately result in improved quality of life and decrease in drop out rate of school going children.

NATURE OF WORK UNDERTAKEN



- Repairs and leak proofing of wells
- Repairs of existing washed out wells
- Underground Bund
- Construction of Kolhapur Type Bund on river
- Reducing water seepage from ponds
- Reinforcing of pond wall
- Construction of sub surface bunds
- Building of gabions on the monsoon streams
- Cordoning of rain springs by way of 'Bandharas'

- Low cost of construction, operation and maintenance.
- 'Participatory Approach' for sustainable implementation
- Confidence build amongst villagers that "self-help is best help"
- Skill developed during execution to become additional source of livelihood for participating youths.
- Concept of "Shraam Daan" used for the benefit of villagers.

Indirect benefits


- Water carrying drudgeries reduced considerably thereby improving health of entire family, especially women.

PROJECT SUSTAINABILITY




- The project was implemented with full participation of villagers, hence there is complete ownership of the project.


