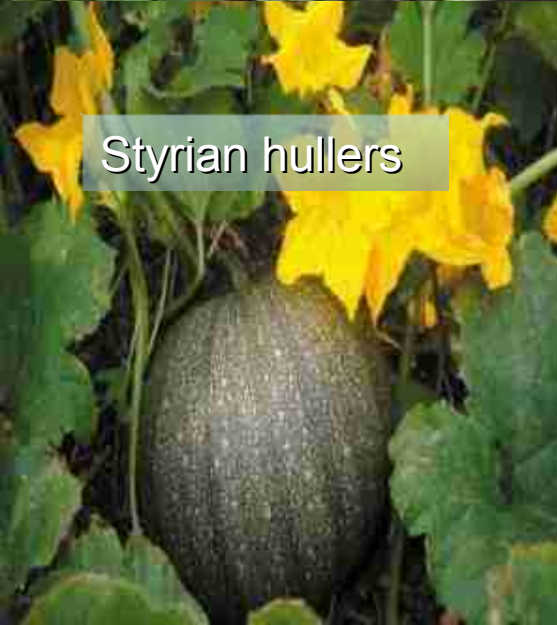

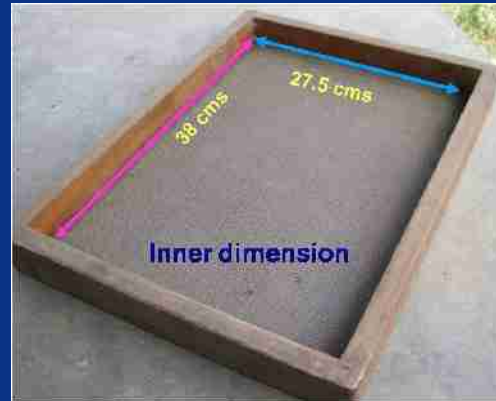

Tomatoes Diversity




Green grape

A cluster of small, round, green grape tomatoes hanging from a vine with green leaves.




Podland pink

Several round, light pink tomatoes hanging from a vine, with some showing a slight red blush.




Burbank

Large, ribbed tomatoes, some green and some ripening to red, hanging from a vine.



Green sausage

Large, round, golden-yellow tomatoes hanging from a vine.

A large quantity of small, round, yellow tomatoes with a distinct rippled texture.
