In general, the conference attracts world renowned speakers from UNICEF, World Bank, ADB, WHO, USEPA and various other educational institutions and NGOs to share their knowledge and experience on WASH topics. With the overwhelming success of the Tenth GWA Conference in 2017 at Kolkata, India, the Board of Directors of GWA decided again on Kolkata, India as a venue for its Thirteenth Annual Conference for the year 2020.

Joint Organiser

The Institution of Engineers (India) - Rural Development Forum (RDF) - The Institution of Engineers (India) (IEI), established in 1920 and incorporated by the Royal Charter 1935, is the largest professional body of the Engineers covering fourteen engineering disciplines. RDF, an Independent Forum of the IEI, has been working to promote and advance the science and practice of all branches of engineering for rural development. Besides other activities in various fields of rural development through awareness programmes, trainings, RDF is trying to help poor people of Rural India in reaching, with their own participation, the goal of clean water and sanitation to have a healthy environment for living. Considering rural perspective of the programme, RDF intends to organize the programme jointly with GWA with a vision to achieve targets of the sustainable development goal by 2030.

Conference Partners - The conference will be held in partnership with Universities in Philadelphia (e.g. the University of Pennsylvania, Drexel University, Temple University, and others) and with Indian Institute of Engineering Science and Technology, Shibpur, and Water Management Forum of The Institution of Engineers (India).

Participants

Experts from international organizations such as UNICEF, Water For People, USAID, NGOs, academia, governments, businesses, students and faculty members from the USA, as well as experts from India, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Nepal and Bhutan, and other countries, both from government and non-government organizations, are expected to actively participate in this conference. Conference theme

The focus of the conference will be on sustainability, innovations, test cases, water quality, wetland preservation, and related issues. The conference shall also discuss the progress of developing countries on the implementation of social, economic and related policies and projects, in achieving the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) for water, sanitation, and hygiene for all (2015-2030). Sustainability will always be the key focus of the discussions during the conference. Participants from various countries will share insights on the progress of implementations of SDGs in their respective countries.

Context: Substantial progress has been made by South Asian countries and the rest of the world in achieving these goals. The Government of India (GOI) started a vigorous program of Swacch Bharat (Clean India https://swachhbharat.mygov.in/) with the objective to provide access to water and sanitation to all. However, there is much work still to be done and the SDGs will not be met without creative and sustained leadership at the local level. The aim of this conference will be to share the key challenges, opportunities and best solutions involving communities, NGOs, academia and various government organizations. This conference will provide an opportunity to the participants to visit WASH projects in rural West Bengal to analyze and identify issues and provide sustainable solutions.

Call for Abstracts

Abstracts are sought for oral presentations dealing with technical, sociological, institutional, financial, educational, and local aspects of WASH implementation to achieve UN SDG 2030 goals. Selected authors will present through a brief presentation (10-15 minutes) followed by an open discussion. Abstract topics should conform to any one of the following topics of various panels of the conference:

- Panel A: Achieving Universal Access to Safe and Affordable Drinking Water by 2030 Country Status Reports
- Panel B: Achieving Access to Adequate and Equitable Sanitation and Hygiene for All and End of Open Defecation by 2030 Country Status Reports
- Panel C: Improving Water Quality by Reducing Pollution and Safe Reuse
- Panel D: Achieving substantial Increase of Water Conservation, Water use Efficiency, Wastewater Reuse
- Panel E: Implementing Integrated Water Resource Management Including Protection of Ecosystems and Wetlands
- Panel F: Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) in Schools
- Panel G: Participation of Local Communities in Improving Water and Sanitation Management
- Panel H: Innovations in Sustainable Implementation of WASH Programs
- Panel I: Assessment of Sustainability of WASH Projects Presentation by Students

Presentation Guidelines

Presentation will be limited to 10-15 minutes. A panel moderator will facilitate an open discussion with the presenters on the panel after the final presentation. Presenters will be required to develop and supply their own PowerPoint slides for their presentations. Presenters will supply slides in electronic form (USB flash drives preferred) at least one week before the conference. Presenters are encouraged to bring handouts or information sheets about their work for interested attendees. Presenters will finance their travel, transportation and hotel cost at their own expense.

Abstract Format

- Within 500 words in MS Word or PDF format
- Include succinct but descriptive title of the presentations, as well as name, affiliation, and contact information (e-mail and telephone numbers) of the authors
- Must include a brief description of the actual project, research, intervention, program or innovation. The abstract should also discuss significant results
- of the efforts, conclusions, or recommendations drawn.
